16" finished block - traditional name "Mosaic #10"

12 blocks = 60" x 76" finished quilt (throw)


20 blocks = 76" x 92" finished quilt (full size)


25 blocks = 92" x 92" finished quilt (queen size)

36 blocks = 108" x 108" finished quilt (king size)

On the back of each 5" background square, draw a diagonal line from one corner to the opposite corner. Draw a diagonal line 1/4" to each side of the center line. The center line is your cutting line. The outside lines are your sewing lines.

Pair a background squares with an assorted fabric squares, right sides together. Sew on both outside lines. Cut along the center line. Open and press. You will have two half square triangle units. Trim these units to exactly 4 1/2" square. Repeat with the same assorted fabric so you have four identical half square triangle units.

Lay out the four half square triangle units in a four patch so the background fabric is to the outside on three of the units, and to the inside on one of the units. Sew the squares together to form two rows, then sew the rows together to form the four patch.



Repeat with the rest of your squares. Combine the four patch units together to form the criss cross block and sew together as you did the four patch unit. Each block is comprised of four different fabrics in a similar color.

When you have your blocks complete, lay them out and move them around until you like the layout. Sew the blocks together to form rows, then sew the rows together to create the center of your quilt.

Add each border one at a time, measuring the center of the quilt and cutting the strip to that length. Sew the long sides on first, then the short sides.
